WHEREAS, On December 2021, the Atlanta City Council unanimously adopted 21-R-3927 and 21-R-3928, which called for a May 2022 referendum to consider three ballot questions to provide \$750 million toward vital transportation, recreation, public safety and arts projects across the city; and

WHEREAS, The City proposed district council members will be able to allocate \$3 million each in discretionary funds to community projects that are not already listed as part of other specified investments; and

WHEREAS, In May 2022, Atlanta voters overwhelmingly approved the three questions that collectively made up the Moving Atlanta Forward infrastructure initiative; and

WHEREAS, The Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation was created in 2004 as a public-private partnership and as an avenue for individuals, small businesses, corporations, and civic groups to assist in meeting the needs of Atlanta's firefighters through sponsorships and donations; and

WHEREAS, The Foundation supports Atlanta firefighters and enhances public safety by funding workforce initiatives, diversity programs, and essential equipment while ensuring resource equity to meet the needs of each community and its neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, The Foundation supports the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department in its ongoing efforts to improve staff recruitment, retention and morale; and

WHEREAS, The Foundation continues to sustain Atlanta as a nationally recognized leader for fire safety, protection, and medical response; and

WHEREAS, Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation's signature program, the Fire Station Fund, allocates immediate funding to help improve and enhance the living and working conditions of the 36 City of Atlanta fire stations and facilities; and

WHEREAS, The City has a unique opportunity to collaborate with the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation to make significant investments in improvements and upgrades in fire stations and communities across Atlanta; and

WHEREAS, Members of the Atlanta City Council desire to commit a portion of their respective discretionary dollars as a donation to the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation and will collaborate with the Atlanta Fire Rescue Department to invest the funds for improvements, upgrades and administration thereof in their respective districts;

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ATLANTA, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAINS, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1:</u> That the Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to transfer an amount not to exceed Six Million Six Hundred Sixteen Thousand Six Hundred Three Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,616,603.00) to the Atlanta Fire Rescue Foundation to support district-specific fire station improvements, upgrades and administration thereof in communities across Atlanta.
